- 2. Review minutes from previous site council. Approval of last meeting's minutes (March 7, 2019). Brought to motion by Christine Rodgers. Seconded by Natalie Knigh.t
- 3. Recognize incoming and outgoing members (Christine)
 - a. Going off: highlighted in yellow 1 staff member (chair) 1 classified and 3 parents
 - 1. The question was brought of whether a must be filled by parents or can a seat be filled by a community representative. Tandi was asked to be a community representative for the 19/20 school year.

- 4. PBIS (Christine)
 - Shamrock positive acknowledgement update

CVH have met the school goal of 500 shamrocks school-wide. Several classes have met goal of 60 shamrocks. This new incentive is going well. All adults in the building got shamrocks to hand out; teachers, classified, bus drivers, kitchen, custodians. Cobi Smallwood

- 2. Karen Shores mentioned incorporating shamrocks into the 21st Century Afterschool Program for the 19/20 school year.
- 5. Student Performance (Christine)
 - 1. SLGG1: The goal for DIBELS was for only 50% of our students to be in red. In January, we were at 58%. There is not comparable data due to high number of absences. It still shows us at 58%. 10% of the student population was lost.
 - 2. SLGG2 The second goal was to decrease major referrals by 20%. The school was at 810. Written major referrals then decreased to 549, making it a 33% decrease, meaning they more than met their goal.
- 6. Instructional Support -
 - Reading Adoption National Geographic's Reach for Reading: For the 19/20 school year, there will a new reading adoption. The curriculum was out on display for staff and parents.
 - 1. AVID Foundation training for all staff. All staff are working on becoming certified in AVID.
 - 2. AVID team training in San Diego. 5 members of staff will be sent to the San Diego in order to be able to teach the staff.
- 7. Culture and Climate -
 - 1. Focus on Bully:

The school has seen improvement in bullying this year. There will continue to be a focus on bullying.

- There are many different curriculums that cover this topic.
- Next school year, there will be a 30 minute a day community time in each classroom.
- Bully prevention will be a major focus of assemblies.
- 2. Skills camp evolving

The school budget is unable to keep both skills camp and TOSA. For next year, the TOSA will be in charge of Skills Camp. Sandi Battles will no longer be our TOSA, making that position open. It will no longer be called "skills camp." Students will be pulled to do lessons and will be a support for kids.
